INSTRUCTIONS - READ CAREFULLY

1. The petition must be legibly handwritten or typewritten and signed by the petitioner, under penalty of perjury. Any false statement of an important fact may lead to prosecution for perjury. Answer all questions in the proper space on the form.
2. Additional pages are not allowed except in answer to questions 11 and 20. Do not cite legal authorities. Any additional arguments or facts you want to present must be in a separate memorandum.
3. When the Clerk of Court receives the \$5.00 filing fee, the Clerk will file your petition if it is in proper order.
4. If you do not have the necessary filing fee, you may ask permission to proceed *in forma pauperis*. To proceed *in forma pauperis*, (1) you must sign the declaration provided with this petition to show that you cannot prepay the fees and costs, and (2) if you are confined in TDCJ-ID, you must send in a certified *In Forma Pauperis* Data Sheet from the institution in which you are confined. If you are in an institution other than TDJC-ID, you must send in a certificate completed by an authorized officer at your institution certifying the amount of money you have on deposit at that institution. If you have access or have had access to enough funds to pay the filing fee, then you must pay the filing fee.
5. Only judgments entered by one court may be challenged in a single petition. If you want to challenge judgments entered by different courts, either in the same state or in different states, you must file separate petitions as to each court.
6. Include all your grounds for relief and all facts that support each ground for relief in this petition.
7. When you have finished filling out the petition, mail the original and two copies to the Clerk of the United States District Court for the federal district within which the State court was held which convicted and sentenced you, or to the federal district in which you are in custody. A "VENUE LIST," which lists U.S. District Courts in Texas, their divisions, and the addresses for the clerk's office for each division, is posted in your unit law library. You may use this list to decide where to mail your petition.
8. Petitions that do not meet these instructions may be returned to you.

Exhaustion of State Remedies: You must ordinarily present your arguments to the highest state court as to each ground before you can proceed in federal court.

Subsequent Petitions: If you fail to set forth all grounds in this petition, you may be barred from presenting additional grounds at a later date.

Following is a list of the most frequently raised grounds for relief in habeas corpus proceedings. Each statement is a separate ground for possible relief. You may raise any grounds, even if not listed below, if you have exhausted your state court remedies. However, you should raise in this petition all available grounds (relating to this conviction) on which you base your belief that you are being held unlawfully.

DO NOT JUST CHECK ONE OR MORE OF THE LISTED GROUNDS. Instead, you must also STATE the SUPPORTING FACTS for ANY ground you rely upon as the basis for your petition.

- (A) Conviction obtained by a plea of guilty which was unlawfully induced, or not made voluntarily, or made without an understanding of the nature of the charge and the consequences of the plea.
- (B) Conviction obtained by the use of a coerced confession.
- (C) Conviction obtained by the use of evidence gained from an unconstitutional search and seizure.
- (D) Conviction obtained by the use of evidence obtained from an unlawful arrest.
- (E) Conviction obtained by a violation of the privilege against self-incrimination.
- (F) Conviction obtained by the prosecution's failure to tell the defendant about evidence favorable to the defendant.
- (G) Conviction obtained by the action of a grand or petit jury which was unconstitutionally selected and impaneled.
- (H) Conviction obtained by a violation of the protection against double jeopardy.
- (I) Denial of effective assistance of counsel.
- (J) Denial of the right to appeal.
- (K) Violation of my right to due process in a disciplinary action taken by prison officials.

A. GROUND ONE: Petitioner was denied the effective assistance of counsel

Supporting FACTS (tell your story briefly without citing cases or law):

Petitioner's trial counsel conducted little discovery in preparing Petitioner's case. Trial counsel did not interview any State or defense witnesses. Trial counsel spent a total of 10 minutes with Petitioner during the course of representation. Trial counsel wholly failed to prepare Petitioner's expert witness. Although trial counsel knew about Petitioner's low I.Q. and learning disabilities, and that counsel had to obtain permission from Petitioner's mother to make decisions for Petitioner, without consulting any other person, trial counsel had Petitioner plead guilty to two counts of aggravated robbery. When the judge admonished Petitioner, trial counsel told Petitioner to look at co-counsel and say "yes" when co-counsel nodded "yes" and say "no" when co-counsel nodded "no."

B. GROUND TWO: The conviction was obtained by a plea of guilty that was not made voluntarily.

Supporting FACTS (tell your story briefly without citing cases or law):

Trial counsel spent a total of 10 minutes with Petitioner during the course of representation. Although trial counsel knew about Petitioner's low I.Q. and learning disabilities, and that counsel had to obtain permission from Petitioner's mother to make decisions for Petitioner, without consulting any other person, trial counsel had Petitioner plead guilty to two counts of aggravated robbery. When the judge admonished Petitioner, trial counsel told Petitioner to look at co-counsel and say "yes" when co-counsel nodded "yes" and say "no" when co-counsel nodded "no." Petitioner's plea was not made voluntarily, and Petitioner did not understand the nature of the charge and the consequences of the plea.

C. **GROUND THREE:** The District Attorney intimidated at least two witnesses from speaking to the defense.

Supporting FACTS (tell your story briefly without citing cases or law):

Petitioner's trial counsel sent a private investigator to speak with one of the alleged victims, Andrew Horvath. Horvath's mother was told by an investigator from the Tarrant County District Attorney's office that they were not to speak to any defense investigators or lawyers. Another witness, Tara Green, was also told by an investigator from the Tarrant County District Attorney's office that she was not to speak to any defense investigators or lawyers.


